Place du Palais de Justice

The Court of First Instance housed in the old praetorium of the convent of the Augustins, was created at the same time as the Sub-Prefecture in 1800. Just as with the church, it is the local carpenter, Honoré Conil who supplies the furniture. The affairs judged concern the justice of the peace and settle neighborhood disputes and petty thievery. It becomes redundant at the fall of the Empire, resuming activity intermittently from 1860, but its use decreases from 1926 onwards and it ceases to function definitively in 1970.

A series of **cantilevered and timbered medieval houses** overlook the square. Note the house found at no. 2 rue Brouchier, the ends of **the ceiling beams are carved and one depicts a head**.
